What is a Spreadsheet?

The grid is organized into **rows** (going across) and **columns** (going down). **Microsoft Excel** and **Google Sheets** are the most popular spreadsheet programs.

Think of it like a notebook page with lots of squares, where each square holds one piece of information. Instead of writing things randomly, everything is neatly organized so you can find it easily.

What Can You Do With a Spreadsheet?
