What Are Striking and Fielding Sports?

These sports have been played for hundreds of years and are popular all around the world. The exciting thing about them is that every player has a different job—some are attacking, some are defending, and the roles swap around during the game.

Famous Examples of Striking and Fielding Sports

The most famous striking and fielding sport is **baseball**, especially popular in **North America**. In baseball, a batter stands at home plate and tries to hit a pitched ball while the fielders spread out across the field to catch or stop the ball. Each team gets **nine players** on the field.

Cricket is another huge striking and fielding sport, played in countries like **India, Australia, Pakistan**, and the **West Indies**. In cricket, a batter (called a batsman) hits a ball bowled at them while fielders try to get them out. A cricket match can last anywhere from **20 minutes** to several **days**!

Rounders is a sport you might play at school. It's similar to baseball but with simpler rules. Players hit a ball and run around four posts while the fielding team tries to tag them out or catch the ball.

Think of it like: One team is the attackers trying to score points by hitting and running, while the other team is the defenders trying to stop them. Then the teams swap roles, just like taking turns in a video game.

Why Are These Sports So Popular?

Striking and fielding sports teach teamwork, strategy, and timing. Everyone on the field has an important job, whether they're attacking or defending. The **batter** needs skill and quick reflexes, while the **fielders** need to communicate and work together to

stop the other team scoring. These sports are also great exercise and can be played by people of all ages and abilities.
