If you get ill in the countryside, the nearest hospital might be an hour away. In a city, one is usually just **15 minutes** travel. Better **schools** with more subjects and resources are easier to access too.

## Better Transport and Connections

**Public transport**—buses, trains, and underground systems—makes it easy to get around cities without a car. Trains connect cities to other places quickly. Countryside areas have fewer buses and trains, so you almost always need a car. Cars are expensive to buy and run.

Think of it like a spider's web: in a city, all the transport routes connect like sticky threads. In the countryside, the threads are few and far between.

## **Social Life and Entertainment**

Cities offer endless **entertainment** and social opportunities. Young people especially enjoy nightlife, live music, sports events, and shopping. Making friends is often easier in cities because there are more people and more activities. This makes city life exciting and fun.
